LOCHHRA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY January 2015

- For January 2015, WV WORKS cases statewide decreased to **8,364**, down **244** cases compared to December 2014's **8,608** cases.
- Adult WV WORKS cases statewide for January 2015 are **3,485**, down **217** cases compared to December 2014's **3,702** cases.
- Child-only cases statewide for January 2015 are **4,879**, down **27** cases compared to December 2014's **4,906** cases.
- Total support service payments for January 2015 totaled **\$417,069**, down **\$71,555** from December 2014's **\$488,624**.
- From December 1st, 2001 through January 31st, 2015, **3,060** WV WORKS cases have closed due to the adult(s) reaching the 60-month limit. Of that amount, **1,827** customers requested an extension of benefits up to an additional 6-month period; **777** of which were approved (for a **42.5**% approval rate).
