# **Legislative Updates**

HB 2427 – Joe's groups met with Jolynn Marra, Director of OHFLAC, who noted there could not be a change to the rule due to being in statute. After further investigation by the group, it was decided that there is nothing in statute that would prevent a rule change. Joe, Phil Shimer, and Mark Drennan will continue to discuss potential changes to the child abuse/neglect registry process through CPS with OHFLAC.

Blocked the 10-year supervision bill.

Parity bill passed - It is unclear whether MCOs have to follow federal parody guidelines. Look at other states, Ohio and Virginia, to see if they are having the same problems with length of stay. Matt

suggested to check with Massachusetts; they passed parity legislation years ago but were not successful establishing an enforcement body.

Harm Reduction bill – people are still trying to figure out how to work with all the rules that were just passed.

Meetings will move from monthly to quarterly after strategic plan is finalized. The next meeting will be held at 3pm on July 19.
