PROGRAM MANAGEMENT DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Direction for Program Staff and Clients:

- All abuse/neglect (child or adult) investigations and subsequent interventions must continue to adhere to DHHR policies and applicable judicial order(s).
- Childcare centers will remain open for business; staff should follow the guidance, policies and procedures of their home agency and regularly consult their supervisors for additional advice on a case-by-case basis.
- To keep families connected with services while managing community risks, consider phone calls and/or virtual meetings rather than in-person meetings when possible and appropriate.
- Reschedule nonessential visits in cases where the client or anyone in the household or the program staff shows signs of illness, including but not limited to fever, cough, and/ or shortness of breath.

If visits are cancelled, contact families on a recurring basis to determine if any referrals are needed.
