Boone, Cabell, Clay, Kanawha, Lincoln, Logan, Mason, Mingo, Putnam and Wayne Counties

Data selected for inclusion in this profile are related to the social determinants of health as well as risk and protective factors related to behavioral health.

Healthy People 2020 defines social determinants of health as conditions in the environments in which people live, learn, work, play, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks. Resources that enhance quality of life can have a significant influence on population health outcomes. Examples of these resources include safe and affordable housing, access to education, public safety, availability of healthy foods, local emergency/health services, and environments free of life-threatening toxins. Healthy People 2020 highlights the importance of addressing social determinants of health by including “create social and physical environments that promote good health for all” as one of the four overarching goals for the decade (<https://www.cdc.gov/socialdeterminants/index.htm>).

Multiple contributing factors can affect an individual’s risk for behavioral health concerns. Risk factors increase the likelihood of someone developing negative behavioral health outcomes, while protective factors increase the likelihood of healthy outcomes. These factors exist in multiple contexts, such as in a society, community, relationship and individual and many are amenable to change (SAMHSA, 2019).

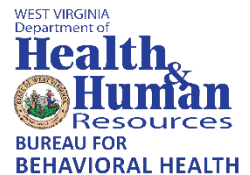
The assessment and planning resource categories included in this profile are demographics, economics, education, health and justice. When combined, these factors can begin to help communities understand the problems they are working to improve as well as the impact of the work that has already been done. The data included can also inform important planning, programming and policy decisions.

The information included in these profiles is not a complete picture of all the factors facing youth and families in West Virginia. However, it is the most up-to-date data available at the time of release for county and regional levels.

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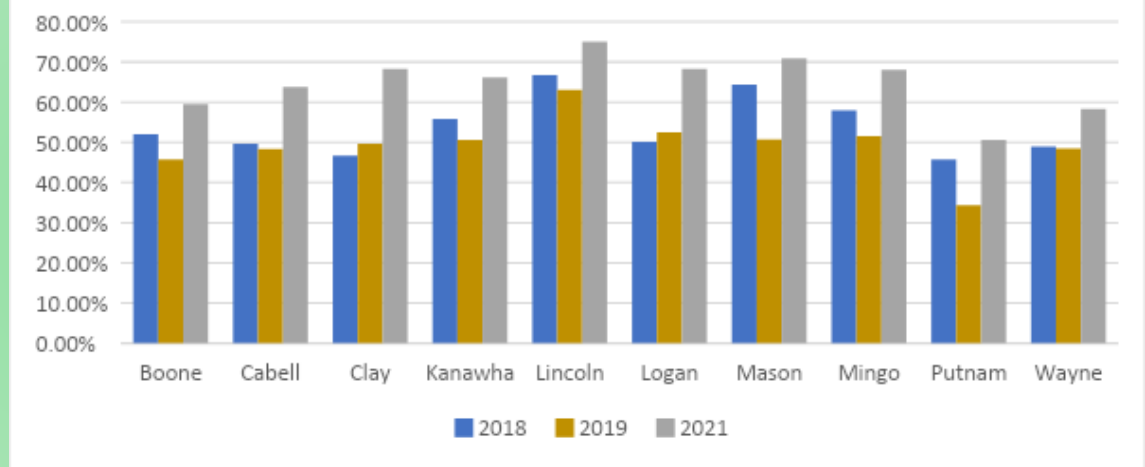

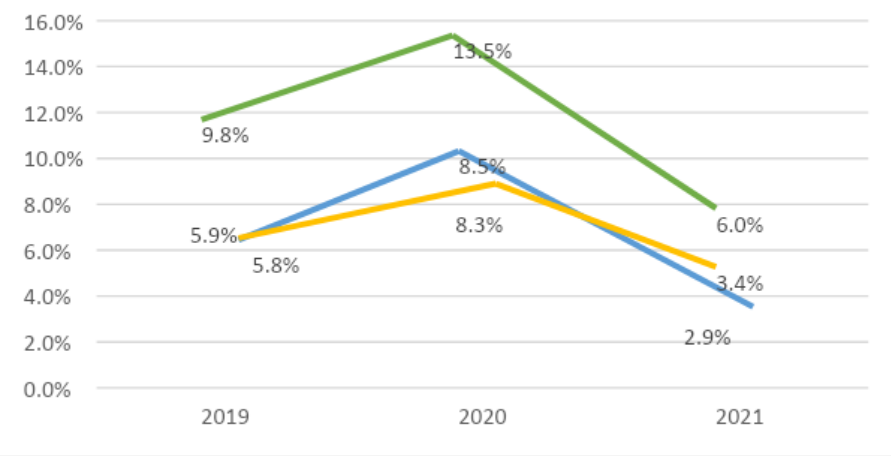
