<p>** An MOCC inmate who died while receiving hospice care for stage 4 metastatic cancer was tested for COVID-19 shortly before his death and was found to be positive. The treating medical provider determined COVID-19 was not a contributing factor. As the test result was received post-mortem, the positive is not included in the above figures.</p>								
About this report:								
<p>Inmates are adults in prisons, jails and work-release facilities. Residents are youths in Juvenile Services facilities. The figures for HCC and MOCC include their satellite work camps. All inmates are tested upon discharge of their sentences or when granted parole. All necessary notifications are provided when inmates subject to release test positive. These cases are not reflected in the above tally.</p>								
<p>Employee figures reflect testing conducted by DCR's medical services providers, and any offsite testing reported to DCR. These figures also include DCR employees not assigned to a facility, such as parole officers.</p>								
<p>Positive: current (active) cases; NOT cumulative. All positive inmates are placed in isolation.</p>								
<p>Total: cumulative tests; refers to number of tests performed and completed, NOT the number of inmates or residents tested.</p>								
<p>Pending: all inmates/residents awaiting test results remain in isolation.</p>								
<p>Recovered reflects CDC guidance, and for employee cases are determined by the facility's local health department.</p>								
<p>Quarantine: inmates/residents NOT showing symptoms but separated because they are new intakes, back from a hospital for unrelated reasons, etc.</p>								
<p>Inmate false positives to date: BCC (1), CRJ (1), MCC (1), NCRJ (1), PHRJ (1), SCC (1), SCRJ (3), TVRJ (1). Employee false positives: BCC (1), NCF (1). All false positives are moved from the positive/recovered columns to the negative column.</p>								
<p>Testing reflects decisions by DCR leadership and facility medical providers, following appropriate guidance and in collaboration with state and local public health authorities.</p>
