<b>332 Short Interpregnancy Interval (Previously titled Closely Spaced Pregnancy):</b> <u>The Definition is revised to reflect a more recent review of data indicating increased risks for adverse perinatal and maternal outcomes with an interpregnancy interval of less than 18 months. In addition, the revised cut-off is consistent with the Healthy people 2020 goal of reducing the proportion of pregnancies conceived within 18 months of a previous birth. <p><b><u>425 Inappropriate Nutrition Practices for Children:</u></b> Only section 425.1.9 (routinely feeding inappropriate beverages as the primary milk source) is revised to be consistent with March 2014 Final Rule: Revisions in the WIC Food Packages [7 CFR Part 246.10€(10)] that allows the option for WIC State agencies to issue reduced-fat milk and/or reduced-fat yogurt to children (1 to 2 years of age) for whom overweight or obesity is a concern.
