



WV Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program Tips for Clinical Providers

- Breast and/or cervical cancer screening visits include:
 - ✓ A physical exam with a medical provider (physician, PA-C, or NP)
 - ✓ Completion of WVBCCSP Medical History Form and the
 - ✓ Completion of Patient Data Form
- If your clinic uses electronic health records, you are not required to complete the specific Medical History form. However, all the required data on this form must be documented and accessible in EHR.
- All boxes on forms must be completed. For the patient data form, if not applicable or patient declines, please note on form.
- Remember to capture time spent with the patient in documentation for billing. On the Patient Data Form, this is listed at the top of the second column under "clinician time".
- Breast screening is covered for women 40-64 years old or under the age of 40 and symptomatic or high risk.
- Breast Cancer Risk assessment should be performed on all women 25 and older (ex. Tyrer-Cuzick Model and Gail Model).
- High risk women are eligible for additional screening.
- A clinical breast exam (CBE) should be performed on all symptomatic patients. A CBE is optional and is not required for screening.
- Cervical Cancer screening is covered for women 21-64 years old.
- A pelvic exam is not required unless used to collect pap smear, HPV, or confirm absence/presence of cervix in patients with hysterectomy.
