Effective immediately, any patient considered for services under the Medicaid Treatment Act (MTA) must be either already enrolled in Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program (BCCSP) or BCCSP eligible. Non-BCCSP patients are no longer eligible for MTA per federal guidelines. Any client already receiving BCC Medicaid will remain in the program; however, we will not accept any new patients into the program that are not BCCSP eligible.

To ensure the program maintains compliance in serving only those patients who qualify for screening services in BCCSP, new requirements for eligibility determination will be forthcoming.
