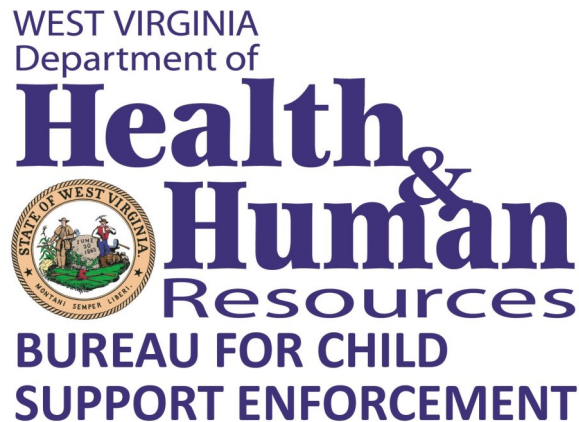

Did You Know?

The **Amnesty Program** was created by the West Virginia Legislature in an attempt to help obligors who have accumulated a large child support arrearage get the debt paid off. If both the obligor and obligee agree, all the interest or a portion of the interest which has accrued can be forgiven. In exchange for erasing the interest, the obligor must agree to pay off the principal amount owed within a 60 month period.

Changing Your Court Order... If you have a substantial change in circumstances due to loss of employment, incarceration, or other involuntary causes, you may petition the court for a modification to your child support obligation. You are still responsi-

ble for paying all child support unless the amount is lowered by the court. You may request assistance from the BCSE, or you may file your own petition. The Circuit Court Clerk has blank petition forms available, if you choose to file the petition yourself. If you proceed on your own, you may be entitled to an expedited modification.

You may request a **court hearing by telephone** if your circumstances require this. It is your responsibility to ask permission from the judge to appear by phone.

Normally, there are fees for filing and serving modifications. You may file a form to have those fees waived in certain circumstances. The petition is called an **Affidavit of Indigency**. You may obtain

this affidavit from your local Circuit Court Clerk's Office.

The **Hardship Policy**....The BCSE will consider limiting the amount collected toward arrearages if you provide proof of income (tax forms, pay stubs, unemployment stubs, disability statement from your doctor) and a Hardship Affidavit. You may request this affidavit from your local Child Support Office. This does not apply to the collection of current support.
