SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

DIFFERENCE MAKERS: THE PUZZLE PIECES OF FAMILY SUPPORT, CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION AND SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH WV DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. BUREAU FOR FAMILY ASSISTANCE.

PRESENTER: DIVISION OF FAMILY SUPPORT DIRECTOR TINA FABER

THIS SESSION WILL PROVIDE PARTICIPANTS WITH DEFINITIONS OF FAMILY SUPPORT, CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION, AND SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH. PARTICIPANTS WILL GAIN AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE THEORETICAL UNDERPINNINGS AND APPLY CONCEPTS ACROSS UNITS. VARIOUS TYPES OF TRAUMA WILL BE EXAMINED, AND PARTICIPANTS WILL GAIN KNOWLEDGE OF HOW THEIR ROLES IN THEIR AGENCIES, AS INDIVIDUALS AND ACROSS SOCIETY WORK INTERDEPENDENTLY TO CREATE STRONGER AND HEALTHIER FAMILIES.

THIS SESSION WILL BE A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF ALL OF THE ORGANIZATIONS AND SERVICES REPRESENTED AT THE DIFFERENCE MAKER CONFERENCE. PARTICIPANTS WILL HEAR A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF EACH PROGRAM AND BE OFFERED THE OPPORTUNITY TO ASK QUESTIONS FROM THE REPRESENTATIVES OF EACH OF THE PROGRAMS ABOUT THEIR INDIVIDUAL SERVICES AND FUNCTIONS. PARTICIPANTS WILL GAIN KNOWLEDGE OF THE DOHS' BROAD ARRAY OF PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES THAT COMPRISE THE DIVISION OF FAMILY SUPPORT. PARTICIPANTS WILL BUILD OFF THIS SESSION DURING THE WORKING CREATIVELY TOGETHER FOR WV FAMILIES: NETWORKING IN OUR COMMUNITIES SESSION THE NEXT DAY.







SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

MEASURING FAMILY SUPPORT AND CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION WITH THE WV FAMILY SURVEY: PUBLIC CONSULTING GROUP

PRESENTERS: EVALUATION SUPERVISOR KIM MAGOON AND EVALUATION ANALYST JILL JOHNSON

THIS SESSION WILL REVIEW THE HISTORY AND OVERVIEW OF THE WV FAMILY SURVEY, WHICH MEASURES PROTECTIVE FACTORS AND CUSTOMER PERCEPTIONS OF VARIOUS PREVENTION PROGRAMS. OUR EVALUATORS WILL BE REVIEWING THE HISTORY OF THE SURVEY AND THE CHANGES THAT WILL BRIDGE THE GAP BETWEEN PREVENTION AND OUR CORE FAMILY SUPPORT AUDIENCE OF WV WORKS PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS.

THE IMPORTANCE OF FATHERHOOD ENGAGEMENT: NATIONAL RESPONSIBLE FATHERHOOD CLEARINGHOUSE

PRESENTER: DIRECTOR KENNETH BRASWELL (WWW.FATHERHOOD.GOV)

SHARING THE IMPORTANCE AND STRUGGLE OF FATHERS IN THE APPALACHIAN CONTEXT WILL BE THE KEY FOCUS OF DIRECTOR KENNETH BRASWELL'S KEYNOTE SESSION. AS THE DIRECTOR OF THE NATIONAL RESPONSIBLE FATHERHOOD CLEARINGHOUSE, KENNETH BRASWELL WILL BRING FORTH WISDOM AND INSIGHT ABOUT THE NUANCES, CHALLENGES AND STRENGTHS MEN IN TODAY'S FAMILIES ENCOUNTER.

BUDGETING AND COST ALLOCATIONS: LEGAL AID OF WV

PRESENTERS: TAMMY MULLINS AND ELIZABETH WEHNER

EXPERIENCED CPA AND CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER OF LEGAL AID OF WV WILL BRING HER PERSPECTIVE OF WORKING WITH MULTIPLE FUNDING STREAMS FROM SMALL COMMUNITY GRANTS TO LARGE FEDERAL GRANTS WITH MULTIPLE TERMS AND CONDITIONS TO THIS SESSION. ASSISTED BY GRANTS MANAGER ELIZABETH WEHNER, TAMMY WILL DISCUSS THE DELICATE BALANCE OF SEPARATING FUNDING AND ENSURING PROPER ACCOUNTING AND RECORD KEEPING EXAMPLES TO OFFER STRATEGIES AND EXPERTISE TO SESSION PARTICIPANTS. THIS SESSION IS CONSIDERED A PEER-TO-PEER LEARNING SESSION AND INDIVIDUAL GRANTEES OF DOHS SHOULD ALWAYS REFER TO THEIR GRANTS/PROGRAM SPECIALISTS WITH QUESTIONS.

WORKING TOGETHER CREATIVELY FOR OUR FAMILIES: NETWORKING IN OUR WV COMMUNITIES PARTICIPANTS WILL RECEIVE SOME BRIEF DIRECTIONS ON INCORPORATING THE NEW MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) GRANT AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS AND THEN WILL BE HAVING CONVERSATIONS WITH OTHER AGENCIES AND STAKEHOLDERS IN THEIR COUNTIES. THIS SESSION WILL ALLOW FOR FURTHER EXPLORATION OF AGENCIES AND PROGRAMS AVAILABLE FROM THE DIVISION OF FAMILY SUPPORT'S GRANTEES TO NETWORK AND BEGIN TO CONSIDER ACTIVITIES AND EXPERTISE THAT CAN BE SHARED FOR THE BENEFIT OF FAMILIES IN THOSE COMMUNITIES.

HELPING FATHERS AFFECTED BY SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

CO-PRESENTERS: NATIONAL FATHERHOOD CLEARINGHOUSE MANAGER PATRICK PATTERSON, FATHERHOOD EXPERT/TRAINER NIGEL VANN, AND AMAZING FATHER AND FATHERHOOD PRACTITIONER JOSEPH STILNER

THIS ENGAGING SESSION WILL EQUIP PARTICIPANTS WITH A FRAMEWORK OF EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICES AND TOOLS TO SUPPORT FATHERS AFFECTED BY SUBSTANCE ABUSE DISORDERS. SESSION ATTENDEES WILL ALSO GAIN AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE UNIQUE CHALLENGES FACED BY FATHERS WITH SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS, INCLUDING SOCIETAL STIGMAS, FAMILY DYNAMICS AND PERSONAL BARRIERS TO RECOVERY.







SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

INTRODUCTION TO MOBILITY COACHING

PRESENTING: WEST VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

MOBILITY CACHING IS AN EVIDENCE-BASED, TRAUMA INFORMED APPROACH TO WORKING WITH FAMILIES TO SET GOALS AND MOVE TOWARDS ECONOMIC MOBILITY. HOLISTIC IN NATURE, PARTICIPANTS WILL GAIN AN UNDERSTANDING OF HOW THE TRAUMA OF POVERTY AFFECTS EXECUTIVE FUNCTIONING AND THE IMPORTANCE OF A COACHING RELATIONSHIP WHEN WORKING WITH FAMILIES. PARTICIPANTS WILL EXAMINE COACHING TECHNIQUES AND DEVELOP A BROAD FOUNDATION FOR FURTHER EXPLORATION INTO MOBILITY MENTORING.

WORKING WITH FATHERS: PROMISING PRACTICES FOR FEMALE LEADERS AND STAFF NATIONAL

RESPONSIBLE FATHERHOOD CLEARINGHOUSE PRESENTERS: FATHERHOOD EXPERT AND TRAINER PATRICIA LITTLEJOHN

THIS SESSION WILL EXPLORE PRACTICAL STRATEGIES AND PROMISING PRACTICES THAT FEMALE LEADERS AND STAFF CAN EMPLOY IN THEIR INTERACTIONS AND WORK WITH FATHERS. THIS SESSION RECOGNIZES THE UNIQUE POSITION OF FEMALE STAFF IN RELATION TO FATHERS AND AIMS TO EQUIP THEM WITH THE SKILLS TO FOSTER POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS AND PROVIDE EFFECTIVE SERVICES.

LEAN ON ME TEAM FOR WV CHILDREN

THIS SESSION EXPLORES THE IMPORTANCE OF SUPPORTING FAMILIES EXPERIENCING CHALLENGES BY LISTENING, AND USING EMPATHY, AFFIRMATION, AND NONJUDGMENTAL SUPPORT. PARTICIPANTS WILL EXPLORE THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN POVERTY AND NEGLECT.

GRANTS BEST PRACTICES: WEST VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF FAMILY SUPPORT

PRESENTER: DIVISION DIRECTOR TINA FABER AND SUPPORTED BY GRANTS MANAGEMENT STAFF

THIS SESSION WILL EXPLORE THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE GRANT AGREEMENT AND INFORM PARTICIPANTS, THE IMPORTANCE OF PROPER GRANT MANAGEMENT. RESOURCES FOR FURTHER EXPLORATION WILL BE PROVIDED. PARTICIPANTS WILL DISCUSS BEST PRACTICES AND ENGAGE IN PEER LEARNING WITH ONE ANOTHER.

SOME KEY POINTS TO KEEP IN MIND:

-CLEARLY OUTLINE WHAT EACH AGENCY/PROGRAM EXPECTS TO GET OUT OF THE PARTNERSHIP AND WHAT THEY WILL PROVIDE TO THE PARTNERSHIP.

-THINK OUTSIDE OF THE BOX. HOW CAN YOU MAKE THINGS BETTER FOR THE CLIENTS YOU ARE ENCOUNTERING IN YOUR SPACES WITH THESE NEW/EXISTING PARTNERS?

-AN ACTIVITY ISN'T REQUIRED EVERY MONTH/QUARTER FOR YOUR PARTNERSHIPS, BUT DON'T LET THEM GET DUSTY. PLAN OUT HOW AND WHEN ARE THE BEST TIMES TO SHARE YOUR EXPERTISE/RESOURCES.

-KEEP YOUR LOCAL BFA COMMUNITY SERVICE MANAGER INVOLVED. WHILE THEY AREN'T SIGNING MOUS WITH YOU, THERE ARE MANY ACTIVITIES AND OPPORTUNITIES THEY CAN HELP GUIDE AND SUPPORT YOUR PARTNERSHIPS WITH.





WHAT IS CIRCLE OF PARENTS?

CIRCLE OF PARENTS IS A NATIONAL NETWORK OF PARENT-LED GROUPS, WHERE PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS SHARE IDEAS, CELEBRATE SUCCESSES, AND ADDRESS THE CHALLENGES SURROUNDING PARENTING. CIRCLE OF PARENTS BEGAN IN 2000 AND NOW HAS GROUPS IN TWO DOZEN STATES. WEST VIRGINIA LAUNCHED CIRCLE OF PARENTS IN 2012 WITH FIVE PILOT ORGANIZATIONS, WHICH HAVE SINCE GROWN TO MORE THAN A DOZEN SPONSORING ORGANIZATIONS HOLDING GROUPS ACROSS THE STATE.

CIRCLE OF PARENTS GROUPS CAN BE OPEN TO THE GENERAL COMMUNITY OR TAILORED TO PEOPLE WHO SHARE PARTICULAR INTERESTS OR CIRCUMSTANCES. ALL GROUPS INCLUDE THESE SEVEN ELEMENTS:

1. **INCLUSIVENESS**: ALL GROUPS ARE FREE OF CHARGE. ANYONE IN A PARENTING ROLE CAN PARTICIPATE. THE ONLY EXCEPTIONS WOULD BE PEOPLE WITH PROBLEMS THAT JEOPARDIZE THE SAFETY OF GROUP MEMBERS OR CHILDREN.

2. **TRUST**: GROUP MEMBERS COUNT ON EACH OTHER TO LISTEN OPENLY, RESPOND HONESTLY AND ACT WITH COMPASSION. THEY KNOW THAT ALL INFORMATION SHARED IN THE GROUP IS CONFIDENTIAL AND NEVER DISCUSSED OUTSIDE THE GROUP, WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE LAW.

3. **RESPECT**: GROUP MEMBERS CAN EXPECT TO HAVE THEIR FEELINGS HEARD IF THEY CHOOSE TO SHARE THEM. THEY CAN ALSO COUNT ON HAVING ENOUGH TIME FOR EVERYONE TO SPEAK. PARENTS, FACILITATORS, AND PARENT LEADERS HONOR CULTURAL TRADITIONS, BOUNDARIES, AND THE NEEDS OF GROUP MEMBERS.

4. **EXPERIENCE-BASED**: PARENTS ARE THE EXPERTS ABOUT THEIR OWN FAMILIES AND THEIR OWN CHILDREN. TOGETHER, PARENTS LEARN FROM ONE ANOTHER ABOUT WAYS TO STRENGTHEN THEIR FAMILIES. GROUP MEMBERS PROVIDE NON-JUDGMENTAL SUPPORT TO ONE ANOTHER.

5. **OWNERSHIP**: THE GROUP BELONGS TO THE PARENTS WHO ATTEND. GROUP MEMBERS DETERMINE THE CONTENT OF MEETINGS AND THE AGENDA, DEFINE THEIR OWN GOALS IN THE GROUP, MODEL HEALTHY INTERACTIONS, ASSURE THAT MEETINGS TAKE PLACE CONSISTENTLY, SET INDIVIDUAL GOALS AND ACT ON THEIR DECISIONS.

6. **POSITIVE PARENTING**: GROUP MEMBERS ASSIST ONE ANOTHER IN DEVELOPING POSITIVE METHODS OF PROBLEM-SOLVING AND RECOGNIZE THAT VIOLENCE AT ANY LEVEL IS NOT AN ACCEPTABLE FORM OF DEALING WITH PROBLEMS AND ISSUES.

7. **SHARED LEADERSHIP**: PARENTS AND GROUP FACILITATORS BUILD A PARTNERSHIP TO SHARE RESPONSIBILITY, EXPERTISE AND LEADERSHIP ROLES. MEMBERS OF THE GROUP HOLD EACH OTHER ACCOUNTABLE FOR THE ABOVE VALUES, ASK FOR CLARIFICATION IF THERE IS SOMETHING THEY DON'T UNDERSTAND, AND REACH OUT IF SOMEONE SEEMS TO BE STRUGGLING.





Hiking, Biking & Kayaking Opportunities

One of the best things about Charleston is the easy access to amazing hiking and biking opportunities. Just moments from downtown, Kanawha State Forest offers nine trails covering more than 25 miles. "The Spotted Salamander" is a paved, level walkway with braille interpretive nature stations designed for both visually impaired and physically challenged guests. Encourage the kiddos to look for (but not touch!) frogs' eggs in the vernal pools next to the trail. Maps are available at the park office, and naturalists regularly lead guided hikes and wildlife programs for visitors.



Coonskin Park and Little Creek Park are just short drives from downtown. Little Creek Park is full of trails, including the Loop Trail that takes you past the Devil's Tea Table, a beautiful rock formation and great place to snap a few photos.

Explore woodland and riverside trails by foot or bike at Coonskin Park. Find the grotto, a perfect spot for pictures.

If you prefer to stay in town, head across the South Side Bridge to the Sunrise Carriage Trail. The Carriage Trail begins at the foot of the hill behind the Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad Depot, which itself is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Drivers can park at the bottom of the hill or at the top. Along the way you'll find several historical gems, including the graves of two female Civil War spies and a memorial to Christa McAuliffe, American teacher and astronaut.

Kayaking

If kayaking is on your agenda, be sure to join the Tour de Coal community float. This annual event takes place in June to highlight and support the work of the Coal River Group, an environmental organization with the goal of restoring the Coal. The float starts at the Coal River Group's Science & Education Center at Meadowood Park in Tornado. Float leisurely – it's not a race – for 12 miles along the Coal River to the city of St. Albans, where finishers can celebrate at Yak Fest in Olde Main Plaza. The Elk River Rail Trail offers several river access points for kayaking, boating, and fishing along the roughly 37-mile course. A kayak launch at the Charleston Coliseum & Convention Center is one of the more unique access points along the trail.

The Tour de Coal takes place on the Coal River "Walhonde" Water Trail.





CWV: Gateway to Newest National Park

"Introducing the nation's newest National Park"

An hour's drive south of Charleston is the nation's newest national park. The New River Gorge National Park and Preserve was named one of the World's Greatest Places 2021 by Time Magazine. With more than 70,000 acres of land along the New River, this natural playground features world-class whitewater rafting, hiking, biking, fishing, and hunting. The New River is one of the oldest rivers on the North American continent, with fossil evidence leading geologists to estimate the New River could be as old as 320 million years. The New River Gorge National Park and Preserve is the nation's 63rd national park. Links to commercial outfitters, trail maps, and basic information are available on the park's website. Adjacent to the national park, Adventures on the Gorge, ACE Adventure Resort, and River Expeditions provide unparalleled outdoor activities both on water and land. Water-based activities in the New River Gorge include whitewater rafting, kayak tours, stand up paddle boarding, and guided float fishing trips. Land-based fun includes zipline tours, mountain biking, guided rock climbs, and bridge tours. AOTG's zipline is one of the longest in America and reaches up to 65 mph, and a one-of-a-kind experience awaits under the New River Gorge Bridge. Take your turn on the explore the entire 3,030 foot length of the bridge – all while securely fastened to a safety harness.







New River Gorge National Park—1 Hour Away

Discover rafting in America's newest National Park: New River Gorge National Park and Preserve. This nearby outdoor adventure hub features some of the best rafting on the planet - from scenic, gentle family float trips to classic whitewater rafting excitement. Experience history, nature, culture and adventures on West Virginia's New and Gauley rivers.



Children ages 6 and up, as well as older adults, can enjoy a low-impact adventure on the majestic and awe-inspiring New River Canyon. This trip is perfect for multi-generational families looking for a soft adventure and an introduction to rafting. On this section of the New River there is an option to paddle an inflatable kayak, also known as a "duckie," for an added challenge.

The Lower New River is appropriate for first-time rafters, ages 12 and up. This section of the New River constricts and narrows forming rugged whitewater suited for beginners to advanced paddlers. Guided expeditions feature equipment and instruction for tackling one of the oldest rivers on the continent. Experience incredible vistas and exhilarating rapids from May to October. Let River Expeditions be your host for this one-of-a-kind adventure in nature. Other outfitters providing outdoor adventures adjacent to the New River Gorge National Park and Preserve include ACE Adventure Resort and Adventures on the Gorge.



The first brick street in the world was laid in Charleston on Summers Street – and you can still see and walk on it.





One of the most iconic landmarks in Charleston is the 23.5 karat gold dome of the West Virginia State Capitol. In addition to the picturesque dome, the State Capitol complex is a perfect destination for those who love architecture, history, art, or slowing down and relaxing outdoors. Take a free indoor tour of the Capitol Building, and, on the second floor be sure to look at the ceiling tiles that are hand carved to represent items from around the state.

The Capitol Complex also is home to the West Virginia State Museum, a free, interactive and informative museum for all ages. Highlights include the Talking Soldier, history of the Floating Capitol, and a remake of Capitol Street from the 1950s.

> For more than 40 years, Mountain Stage has been the home of live music on public radio. The show is recorded in front of a live audience at the State Culture Center on the Capitol Grounds. Hear seasoned legends and emerging stars from across the musical spectrum. 

Ask locals of a certain age about Kanawha City, and they, no doubt, will get a nostalgic twinkle in their eyes. For decades MacCorkle Avenue, aka the Kanawha City Strip, was a weekend destination for teenagers – the place to see and be seen. Today, Kanawha City retains a few old favorites from those years and is home to specialty retailers, local eateries, West Virginia's largest hospital, and the city's namesake college, the University of Charleston.

Fun Fact: The University of Charleston's Men's Soccer team won NCAA Division II National Championships in 2017 and 2019! Go Golden Eagles!

Biking is one of the fastest growing sports – Charleston hosts the USA Pro Road Championships 2024-2028 – and one of the go-to spots for bikes and equipment is Charleston Bicycle Center. Tucked away on 53rd street, you will find bikes for all riders. Walking in the shop, you are greeted by friendly, expert staff who will help you pick the perfect ride from children's bikes to big kid mountain biking and street riding models. Charleston Bicycle Center also has a huge selection of apparel, repair items, helmets and more.

Their passion for riding doesn't stop in the shop. Charleston Bicycle Center, which was established in 1988, is heavily involved in local youth mountain biking programs.

Cruise on over to Budget Tapes and Records, the state's "hippest record store and lifestyle emporium." Budget has been cranking

rock 'n' roll in its storefront for over 50 years. Shop for vinyl, tie-dye and "lifestyle accessories" and you'll leave with a traditional hand-written bill of sale.

A hidden gem located on the back roads of Kanawha City is M&M Mart. This deli counter serves up massive made to order sandwiches that everyone in the community talks about.
