

## **LOCHHRA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

### **November 2014**

- For November 2014, WV WORKS cases statewide decreased to 8,609, down 127 cases compared to October 2014's 8,736 cases.
- Adult WV WORKS cases statewide for November 2014 are 3,730 down 86 cases compared to October 2014's 3,816 cases.
- Child-only cases statewide for November 2014 are 4,879, down 41 cases compared to October 2014's 4,920 cases.
- Total support service payments for November 2014 totaled \$501,818, down \$8,320 from October 2014's \$510,138.
- From December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2001 through November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2014, 3,058 WV WORKS cases have closed due to the adult(s) reaching the 60-month limit. Of that amount, 1,816 customers requested an extension of benefits up to an additional 6-month period; 770 of which were approved (for a 42.4% approval rate).

- √ 4,879 Child-only cases ---- parents not in the home and children living with a relative, or parents in the home, are receiving Medicaid and are excluded from the WV WORKS payment.
- √ 207 Cases currently receiving WV WORKS and received TANF in another state before moving to West Virginia.
- √ 108 Cases where parents are excluded from the payment due to being convicted of a drug-related felony after August 22, 1996.
- √ 2,235 Cases receiving Medicaid but not SNAP.
- √ 58 Cases receiving SNAP but adults not receiving Medicaid.
- √ 1,132 Adults receiving WV WORKS and are employed.
