

## LOCHHRA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY July 2024

- For July 2024, WV WORKS cases statewide decreased to **4,648**, down **40** cases, compared to June 2024's **4,688** cases.
- Adult WV WORKS cases statewide for July 2024 are **1,219**, down **15** cases, compared to June 2024's **1,234** cases.
- Child-only cases statewide for July 2024 are **3,429**, down **25** cases, compared to June 2024's **3,454** cases.
- Total support service payments for July 2024 totaled **\$170,368**, down **\$1,300** from June 2024's **\$171,668**.

From December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2001, through July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, **3,640** WV WORKS cases have closed due to the adult(s) reaching the 60-month limit of that amount, **2,106** customers requested an extension of benefits up to an additional 6-month period; **904** of which were approved (for a **42.9%** approval rate).
