

## LOCHHRA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### March 2025

- For March 2025, WV WORKS cases statewide decreased to **4,664**, down **76** cases, compared to February 2025's **4,740** cases.
- Adult WV WORKS cases statewide for March 2025 are **1,310**, down **43** cases, compared to February 2025's **1,353** cases.
- Child-only cases statewide for March 2025 are **3,354**, down **33** cases, compared to February 2025's **3,387** cases.
- Total support service payments for March 2025 totaled **\$175,901**, up **\$26,803** from February 2025's **\$149,098**.

From December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2001, through March 31st, 2025, **3,662** WV WORKS cases have closed due to the adult(s) reaching the 60-month limit of that amount, **2,118** customers requested an extension of benefits up to an additional 6-month period; **912** of which were approved (for a **43.1%** approval rate).
