10.02 <u>Coordination of Program Services</u>

POLICY:

The West Virginia WIC Program can share participant's certification information with health, education and social service programs, that serve the WIC-eligible population. The information is used to determine eligibility for these programs, and for outreach and educational purposes.

PROCEDURE:

The Local Agency will coordinate WIC services with other health, education and social service programs according to the conditions outlined in the written agreements. Agreements between the West Virginia WIC Program and the specific programs of interest are attached.
