### LOCHHRA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY June 2013

- For June 2013, WV WORKS cases statewide decreased to 10,025, down 149 cases compared to May 2013's 10,174 cases.
- Adult WV WORKS cases statewide for June 2013 are 5,061, down 154 cases compared to May 2013's 5,215.
- Child-only cases statewide for June 2013 are 4,964, up 5 cases compared to May 2013's 4,959 cases.
- Total support service payments for June 2013 totaled \$807,080, down \$98,190 from May 2013's \$905,270.
- The number of adult cases receiving WV WORKS for less than 12 months data has not been provided by RAPIDS since February 2012, due to data program changes.
- From December 1, 2001 through June 30th, 2013, 2,869 WV WORKS cases have closed due to the adult(s) reaching the 60-month limit. Of that amount, 1,717 customers requested an extension of benefits up to an additional 6-month period; 707 of which were approved (for a 41.2% approval rate).
