# LOCHHRA EXECUTIVE SUMMARY October 2014

- For October 2014, WV WORKS cases statewide increased to 8,736, down 76 cases compared to September 2014's 8,812 cases.
- Adult WV WORKS cases statewide for October 2014 are 3,816, down 74 cases compared to September 2014's 3,890 cases.
- Child-only cases statewide for October 2014 are 4,920, down 2 cases compared to September 2014's 4,922 cases.
- Total support service payments for October 2014 totaled \$510,138, up \$44,046 from September 2014's \$466,092.
- From December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2001 through October 31<sup>st,</sup> 2014, 3,057 WV WORKS cases have closed due to the adult(s) reaching the 60-month limit. Of that amount, 1,807 customers requested an extension of benefits up to an additional 6-month period; 764 of which were approved (for a 42.3% approval rate).

- $\sqrt{1,137}$  Adults receiving WV WORKS and are employed.
